

We have been learning

Africa (Year R)	This week we enjoyed a visit from Mr Nash who is from the Rudgwick Preservation Society. He told us lots of information about the history of Rudgwick which has made us even more excited about our upcoming trip to Horsham Museum next week! In phonics, we have enjoyed playing lots of games to help us with our Fred talking and blending as well as a game of bingo to help us remember the digraphs and trigraphs we have learnt. In French, we continued our topic of food and role played being in a restaurant. In maths, we are doing really well with learning our number bonds to 10, thinking about the composition of number and noticing patterns when doubling numbers. Woodland learning was great fun, we explored that area looking for signs of changing seasons. It was our last PE session with Mrs Davies on Friday and we continued our ball skills. We are getting really good at throwing, catching, bouncing and controlling a ball. Once again, a busy but fun week of learning. Well done everyone!
Asia (Year 1)	Another busy week! In English, we have been learning facts about meerkats and have learnt so many! Did you know the black circles under their eyes, act like sunglasses? In Science, we have been learning about animals and their diet and whether we would classify them as a carnivore, herbivore or omnivore. In maths, we have moved on to multiplication, we started the week off with counting in tens, moving on to equal and unequal groups. Later in the week because we wowed Miss Beadle we went on to adding equal groups together using repeated addition, and challenging ourselves to write the times table number sentence with it. It was very exciting on Thursday as we had a visit from Miss Verran who brought in her 6 week old rabbits, they were very cute and lively! In PE, we are still practising for Sports Day and moved on to the egg and spoon race and relay race.
Europe (Year 2)	We have loved this week and all things pirate related! In English, we are becoming authors and have spent time planning and talking about ideas for our own pirate adventures. In maths, we have been comparing and ordering lengths and in science, we used iPad to research animals that live in the ocean. We have spent time talking about our mental health and how it is so important to respect ourselves. In PE, we practised using tennis racket and impressed Mrs. Hutchings with our skills! In RE, we learnt about the importance of Mary in the month of May. We made flowers to celebrate her as a symbol in Christianity. We linked woodland learning to our art learning and learnt about the artist Hugo Pineda. He creates amazing tie dye patterns and we did our own! We used natural dyes made with turmeric, blackcurrants and spinach. We can't wait to see how they turn out!
Australasia (Year 3)	In Literacy, we have published our 'Glorious Gardens' and in the sunshine this week they have really been glorious! The children have demonstrated some of their best descriptive and creative writing this year! We have started to look at our new text 'Interview with a Tiger' by Andy Seed, in readiness for interviewing our own garden creature. In Maths, we have learnt about equivalent fractions and what 'equivalence' means. Through our topic work we have been finding out about global warming, the causes and effects.

Antarctica (Year 4)	The sunshine certainly put a smile on our faces this week! We have edited and published our persuasive leaflets about Brazil - the persuasive language used was brilliant! In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting money and finding change. We explored the different layers of the rainforest and learnt why Mother Teresa is such an important figure for Christians. In Science, we investigated complete and incomplete circuits and examined what the possible reasons for those may be. In Computing, we used Scratch to animate our names using a series of loops. We looked at how plants growing in the rainforest are specially adapted to these conditions and we then designed our own plants or flower. The plot of "The Explorer" is getting very exciting!
North America (Year 5)	We've been really impressed with the children's maths this week, as they have shown good understanding of the concepts behind dividing decimal numbers by integers. The class have been publishing and illustrating their fantastically exciting (and sometimes tremendously sad) stories based on 'The Legend of Podkin One-Ear' and now they are starting to create instructions for rabbits how to overcome the evil Gorm! In art, we have been exploring the concept of perspective and using the vanishing point to help make drawings look three dimensional and realistic. Our hitting skills in baseball have improved again this week – next stop, Major League Baseball!
South America (Year 6)	Year 6 have completely blown us away this week. They have embodied all the school values and pushed themselves to stay positive and believe that they can achieve. They worked so hard and they should all be proud of their achievements! They were resilient, they persevered and stayed motivated all week, even in 'normal' lessons. Apart from SATs, the children have been finishing their narratives which are very atmospheric. They have been creating a background on the computer for their art project and we have been completing our unit on cooking. The children tasted food, planned their recipe and made springs rolls. A really successful week in South America class and the children have definitely earned a restful weekend.
