



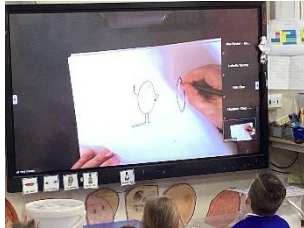

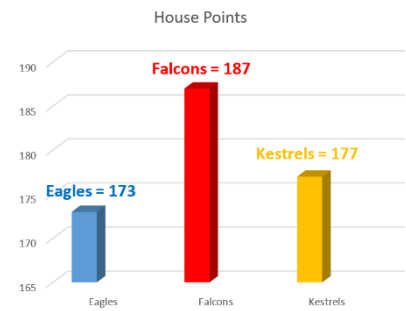

We have been learning

Africa (Year R)	<p>This week in Africa class we learnt all about Chinese New Year, this year being the year of the Tiger. We made beautiful cherry blossom trees using twigs from the playground and pink tissue paper. Our topic book this week has been Little Red Riding Hood and we have been sequencing the story using term first, next, then and last. We enjoyed an online meet the author and illustrator session and learnt lots about the story Pip and Egg. Woodland learning was really fun; we role played the story of Little Red Riding Hood wearing capes and masks, taking it in turns to be the wolf! In French, we learnt how to say eyes, ears, nose and mouth and played a fun game pinning pictures of our features onto a giant face. We also learnt a number song counting up to 10. Phonics this week, introduced us to two new types of sound called split digraphs. We practised recognising them in words we read. Such a busy and fun week, well done everyone!</p>
Asia (Year 1)	<p>Another brilliant week in Year 1, we started the week off with some gymnastics in PE, where we have been learning to balance and hold shapes on various pieces of equipment. We have continued our own paintings of Kandinsky's 'Concentric Circles'. They look amazing! In French with Madame Kent, we started learning different parts of the face. It was great excitement as we had a virtual visit from an author and illustrator of a book called 'Pip and Egg', this is one of our 'Picture Books to Shout About'; we thoroughly enjoyed it and learnt how to draw the characters. We had another fantastic lesson in music with Mrs Eames. In English, we have been thinking of adjectives, we can use to describe Traction Man. In maths, we have continued our learning of place value and have been adding on a number line and looking at the relationship in the fact families. We combined History and Computing together this week, and were writing facts about</p>

	<p>Florence Nightingale on the computers. Lastly, in Science, we were labelling parts of a tree and their functions.</p>
<p>Europe (Year 2)</p>	<p>Well Europe Class, you have done us proud this week! I have heard nothing but great things about you all and I know that everyone has loved teaching you, so thank you!</p> <p>In English, the class have published their finished stories that they have worked so hard drafting and editing over the last couple of weeks. They each made a little book and became authors and illustrators. In maths, the children recapped odd and even numbers, as well as continuing to explore division. In science, they used playdough and other materials to learn how certain objects can be manipulated by squashing, bending, stretching and twisting. The class have also impressed Mrs. Mussell with their dance efforts and Mr. Tucker with their understanding and maturity of how to stay safe.</p>
<p>Australasia (Year 3)</p>	<p>In Literacy, we have planned our dragon narratives by drawing story maps, listening to Mrs Hoyte's version and by creating a piece of drama. Next week, we are all set to start drafting! In maths, we applied our multiplication knowledge to different word problems and situations. In science, we have been learning about the human skeleton – please ask us to tell you the names of some bones. We continue to be super stars when it comes to our swimming lessons and are excellent ambassadors to the school being safe, enthusiastic and sensible.</p>
<p>Antarctica (Year 4)</p>	<p>Our maths focus this week has been calculating area and perimeter. We have used our times tables knowledge to help us to do this efficiently. In English, we have recited poetry, used dialogue to advance action and used figurative language. Our moving animals are coming along nicely and we had to use our collaborative skills to work as part of a group in Design and Technology. In Computing, we recognised how the content of the World Wide Web is created by people. In Science, we conducted an experiment to see how sound is absorbed. We looked at the work of the famous graffiti artist, Keith Haring, and made our own versions of his work, using our sketchbooks.</p>
<p>North America (Year 5)</p>	<p>Year 5 have been enjoying Philip Pullman's wonderful and chilling 'Clockwork' and we've started to look at the ways in which he has made it such a gripping book to read. So far, we have been thinking about how he has created characters whose futures we are so interested in! In maths, we have started to apply our knowledge of multiplication tables and unitisation in order to calculate decimal place times tables and understand what happens when we count in equal groups of decimal fractions. This week we completed our science investigation into forces by running experiments and recording data, and then analysing what that information could tell us.</p>

South America (Year 6)

It has been a great week in South America and so lovely to have nearly everyone back! We have been learning about algebra in maths and the children have really got to grips with the concept and starting to apply their knowledge. We have been planning and drafting our own narratives that continues the story in Beetle Boy. They have introduced a new character and thought carefully about the events that take place. In music, we have all learnt the beginning of our song on the glockenspiel – it sounds very impressive already. In PE, we have continued our gymnastics journey and been working on pair balances and counter tension. We have also continued learning about classification of animals in science and learnt all about vertebrates and invertebrates. In Geography, we have looked at how the UK and European borders have changed over time.



Next week we will be doing lots of fun and educational activities for children's mental health week. We will be kicking the week off with a whole school assembly themed *Growing Together* and ending the week on Friday with *Dress to Express* yourself day. **Dress to Express** is an opportunity for self-expression and celebrating a diverse range of emotions. The children may wear their favourite colour, range of colours or whole unique outfit.

The children may wear their own chosen outfit on Friday 11th February.


