Mathematics

Number - Place Value

- Count in steps of 2, 3, 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward.
- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words.
- Begin to recognise tens and ones
- Represent numbers using objects and pictures
- Use and understand place value charts
- Compare objects, order objects and numbers

Number – Addition & Subtraction

- Fact families
- Check calculations
- Compare number sentences
- Related facts Bonds to 10
- Add and subtract 1s; Ten more and ten less; Add and subtract 10s

Money

- Count money in pence, pounds, notes and coins
- Select money
- Make the same amount
- Compare money
- Find the total, difference and change
- Solve two-step problems

Art, DT & Music



ART

- We will explore drawing to develop and share our ideas, experiences and imagination. We will be using a range of materials creatively to design and make a collage of an animal in the style of Olivia Pilling.

Music - Following the West Sussex Music Programme: Pulse and Rhythm + notation

- Steady pulse
- Moving to music
- Copy back more complex rhythms, read rhythms, create using symbols
- Standard names of notes

PE

Invasion Games

- We will be mastering basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and coordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities and games.

RSHE

This half term we will be learning about being healthy, which links to our science learning.

- We will consider amongst other aspects: - what keeping healthy means and different ways to keep healthy.
- Foods that support good health and the risks of eating too much sugar
- How physical activity helps us to stay healthy; and ways to be physically active every day.
- Why sleep is important and different ways to rest and relax.
- simple hygiene routines that can stop germs from spreading.

Computing

- This half term we will develop our understanding of what computing is and will begin to identify examples.
- We will discuss where they have seen technology in use at school and beyond, in settings such as shops, hospitals, and libraries.
- We will investigate how technology improves our world, and they will learn about the importance of using technology responsibly.

English

Speaking and Listening

- This half term we will be learning to give an opinion with a reason, listen to others' opinions and appreciate that they could be different to our own. When exploring poetry, we will recite and perform simple poems about pets and use this experience to write our own.

Reading

- This half term we will be using our key text, to help us retell the story by sequencing key events; using story language and key words and phrases. We will make predictions about possible events in the story and why characters are behaving in certain ways. We will begin to explore inference and reading between the lines to gauge what the writer is trying to tell the reader.

Writing (half term focus; story writing, poetry and non-fiction writing)

- This half term we will be learning to understand that there are different purposes for writing and how we decide upon the best one for what we want to write about. We will be talking about ideas for writing and sharing these with others, whilst using suggested models to map these ideas out (e.g. Story Mountains)
