

We have been learning

Africa (Year R)	This week has been jam packed! We had a visit from the lovely Mrs Wilford and the equally lovely Mrs Knight, sharing their experiences of attending Rudgwick Primary School. They showed us some amazing pictures, which really helped with our new topic 'Me and My Community'. In maths, we are consolidating our knowledge of doubles and have started our number bonds to 10. Woodland learning was really fun! We did some bug hunting and used bug sucker pots to collect bugs. We also used recipe cards to make some woodland treats...mmmm yummy pinecone cakes! In French, we watched an interesting video on the process of making 'la baguette'. Then we tasted one! We all really enjoyed a visit from Miss Verran who brought in her baby rabbits! Such a fab week!
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Asia (Year 1)	Wow, another busy week has flown by! We have been continuing our learning of French foods and even got to try some baguette from Madame Kent this week. Yum yum! We continued our learning of our core text 'Meerkat Mail', and Sunny even went on holiday; in the washing machine and even relaxing outside in the sunshine! We got to write our own postcards pretending to be Sunny the meerkat. In music, we have started learning to play the recorder, which was very noisy! In maths, we have come to the end of our learning on measurement by finishing with capacity, we started the week with some practical learning and learning all the mathematical terms, then we drew our own liquid in cups. We were very lucky to have a visit from Mr Meaney who taught us lots about striking and fielding in PE. In computing, we are learning about labels and grouping objects. Lastly in science, we were thinking about the different types of animals and their diets; deciding whether they were a carnivore, herbivore or omnivore.
Europe (Year 2)	Another lovely week in Year 2 - another jam packed one too! In English, we started using our core book 'The Pirate Cruncher' and have used it to write down key words and phrases, as well as planning and writing character descriptions. In maths, we have begun learning about measure and measuring in centimetres. In science, we are looking more closely at ocean habitats and the animals that live in them. In music, we swapped from the djembe drums to ukuleles and enjoyed learning the names of each part and finding the lowest and highest note. We were visited by Mr Meaney from The Weald who showed us some great fielding games, which we then practised with Mrs Hutchings on Thursday. In computing, we used ipads to write songs using lots of different notes. It was very loud! Finally, in history, we began exploring pirates from the past. It was really interesting to find out facts.
Australasia (Year 3)	In our English lessons we have made great progress in writing our guides to a 'glorious garden.' We have been inspired by this to develop our outside area and have been busy sorting, tidying and planting this week. We are very excited to observe these changes over the term. In Science we have learnt what plants need to successfully grow and are beginning to understand the processes behind these requirements. In Maths, we are continuing to learn about fractions and as always we are working hard on our times table knowledge. In Music, we have started to learn the recorder and, in PE, we are developing our tennis skills.
Antarctica (Year 4)	A shorter week than normal but still very productive! In Maths this week, we have been learning about using pounds and pence, adding and subtracting money and estimating amounts of money. In English, we have been researching Brazil, ready for writing a persuasive leaflet about why we should visit Brazil. We are focusing on the use of persuasive language to entice visitors. We built simple circuits in Science and used oil pastels to shade a rainforest animal onto black paper in Art. In Computing, we learnt that there are infinite loops and count-controlled loops in Scratch and we modified code to represent this. In P.E. we are working on improving our tennis skills.

<p>North America (Year 5)</p>	<p>It's been another busy week in Year 5! The fabulous Emily Barden has been in touch (she was the driving force behind the concert at Chichester Cathedral and wrote a number of the songs as well as conducting) to share a song she has written as part of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. We joined a Zoom lesson today to start to learn the song with her and other schools. We have also enjoyed a gymnastics masterclass with Mrs Thompson, revised our numbers to 50 and learnt how to tell people what we did at the weekend with Mme Kent in French, and practised hitting and fielding techniques in baseball. In computing, we have been looking at ever more complex coding language. We have continued reading 'The Legend of Podkin One-Ear' and as well as inspiring story writing (we're nearly ready to publish!), it has introduced the topic for this term – The Balance. This has led us to start thinking about the balance in the environment around us and around the world, and we have thought of questions about what is happening that we would like to answer. In maths, we have been focused on problem solving and how to understand which concepts and strategies to use in different situations.</p>
<p>South America (Year 6)</p>	<p>A lovely sunny, summery week in Year 6. We have been working hard in maths consolidating some key skills including; parts of circles, converting and calculating with different units of measure and solving multi-step problems with decimals. We have continued to read our book in English and have been planning and drafting a narrative where Coraline opens the door to reveal the brick wall has gone and in its place is a long hallway. In science, we have finished investigating the flexibility of our feet and analysed the results and in history we have started to look at the Wars of the Roses. The children have also been looking at recipes in D&T ready for our cooking next week. Next week we know is going to be a little different for the children but we have worked this week on feeling calm and confident. Please take the weekend to rest, do nice things as a family and switch off. This is the best preparation we can ask for. Enjoy the sun and I look forward to seeing all the children at 8:30am on Monday for our breakfast together.</p>
