## We have been learning

Africa	What a lovely last week we have had in Africa class. We have been busy
(Year R)	learning how to weave paper to make Easter baskets. We have listened
	to stories about why we celebrate Easter and have discovered that many
	animals hatch from eggs at this time of year. We ended the week with a
	very exciting Easter egg hunt around the school. In Maths this week we
	have been learning about 3-D shapes and we have been identifying these
	shapes in objects found around the classroom. In Woodland Learning we
	were excited to find that bluebells have started to appear, which means
	there are now 7 different woodland flowers in our woods. Mrs Worth has
	been amazed with how well we have progressed with our reading this
	half-term, she says we are reading superstars! Mrs Worth and Mrs Knight
	wish us all a very Happy Easter.
Asia	What a busy end to the term we've had! We have been working our socks
(Year 1)	off putting the finishing touches to our people who help us books – creating
	detailed front covers, page numbers and contents pages. In Computing we
	have been looking at programming, using the bee bots to explore writing
	simple code and exploring how to edit a sequence when things don't go
	quite right. In PE we have been continuing to look at movement and
	jumping, transitioning from one movement to another. We have also been
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	working really hard on our phonics and reading this week. Please make sure you fit in some reading opportunities over the Easter break – even reading the back of the Easter egg box counts! Have a lovely break and see you in the SUMMER TERM!
Europe (Year 2)	A shorter week than normal, but we have still fitted in lots of learning, as well as lots of fun! In English, we finished reading The Tin Forest and used it to help us write in role as the old man and write comparative sentences using the suffix er/est. In maths, we learnt to read and estimate temperature and in science we reviewed our plant growth of the testing we have been doing. It was really cool to observe the results! We had fun in computing using the J2data program to create pictograms and block charts and in our final PE for the term, we played some awesome team games that helped to encourage teamwork and collaboration. Happy Easter all! Enjoy!
Australasia (Year 3)	A day short, but we still packed a lot into the week. We wrote up our short stories and learnt how to write reflective story endings. We completed our collage work and learnt that the tribes living in Britain when the Romans came to invade had two choices – strike a deal with the Romans or fight. In maths, we considered the size of wholes in relation to parts. We explored creating same size parts with different wholes and different size parts with same size wholes. In gymnastics, we used the vault for the first time. We learnt how to run up to the vault and land on it safely with either our feet or our knees. We also came across small ducks hiding out across the school. Strange indeed.
Antarctica (Year 4)	A very busy final week in Year 4 with lots of topics and projects being finished. In maths, we looked at how to collects and present data using bar charts and line graphs. We focused on asking questions about them and what information could be gathered. In English, we have completed our comic strips on Tudor Life. In Science, we looked at the effect different liquids have on our teeth with an investigation using eggs – A lot of fun! The children had their final Woodland Learning session and despite the wet weather enjoyed toasting marshmallows and making smoors by the fire. We completed our Tudor printing with our own version of a Tudor Rose to make a repeating pattern and finally made an animal with a moving part using different joining techniques in DT with great success! Have a super Easter break!
North America (Year 5)	And that's the end of the Spring term! A great final week in North America with yet more guests. Volunteers from the charity Little Lifesavers showed the children what they might do in the event of somebody collapsing or choking and practicing different techniques on mannequins. In English, we finished writing a newspaper report recounting the events of the Battle of Hastings using formal conjunctions, adding quotes and incorporating journalistic phrases. The children evaluated their clay tiles in art, thinking carefully about their successes and what they might do differently when working with clay in the future and in computing we experienced what a computer-based database looks like. We then compared this to the paper- based versions we created last week. Have a fantastic Easter break everyone!
South America (Year 6)	We have made it to the end of the Spring term. The children have been brilliant all term and worked hard right up until the end. We have been finishing Darwin's Dragons in English and finding out what happened with the dragon eggs found in the Galapagos. In PE, we created sequences in gymnastics and performed them to the class. In science, we thought about evolution of humans and suggested an adaptation we would like to see in

	the future and we have been investigating foot flexibility by measuring each other's feet. In art, we have been finishing our carving and begun to print our final pieces of paper. Enjoy a well-earned Easter break and I will see you in two weeks!
