We have been learning

Africa (Year R)	This week Mrs Worth has been really impressed with our phonics skills and has noticed how well we are all progressing with our reading. She says we really do amaze her! We have continued to work on our number bonds to 10. We even managed to incorporate a giant ten frame into our PE lesson. On Tuesday, we watched an episode of Peppa Pig, spoken in French. This helped us to learn the French words for Mother, Father, Sister and Brother. We have finally noticed that our beans (placed in bags on the window during our Fairy-tale topic) have started to sprout! We have recorded our observations and are looking forward to seeing what happens next.
Asia (Year 1)	We have had a busy week showing off our impressive phonics skills and wow have the children impressed us! We have been learning to count in 2s and 5s in maths and have started thinking about comparing objects using height and length. In computing, we have been continuing to think about gathering data by looking at how different objects could be grouped

	<p>according to their properties. We have been creating our own version of Wassily Kandinsky's concentric circles and wow have the children knocked our socks off with those! In science we have been thinking about common garden and wildflower plants and have been out on a hunt to see which wildflowers are growing in the school grounds. In Geography we have been thinking about where in the UK dinosaur fossils have been discovered and have shown this on a map of the UK! Well done Asia class another fantastic week of hard work!</p>
Europe (Year 2)	<p>The penultimate week of the spring term and we started a new book! The Tin Forest by Helen Ward is a beautifully written and illustrated book that compliments our first core text well. It has helped us to discuss key words and phrases and explore inference in our English this week. In maths, we have learnt about fractions of shape in terms of half, quarters and thirds. In science, we deepened our knowledge of what a plant needs to stay healthy by spotting signs of an unhealthy plant. In computing, we collected our own data to create pictograms using a programme on the ipads. In music, we have been practising all the skills we have secured and are developing a real confidence to use the ukulele. In Geography, we compared Brazil with England in terms of human and physical features and climate. One week to go and lots of Easter fun planned! Happy Friday everyone!</p>
Australasia (Year 3)	<p>This week was sadly our last swimming lesson at Billingshurst Leisure Centre and what an amazing time we've had! Miss Lee, Mrs Ryan and Mrs Smith have been so impressed with how beautifully they represented the school during these lessons, they really did us proud! All the instructors commented on what lovely children we have at our school and how much they looked forward to teaching us! Well done Year 3! A huge thanks to Mrs Town, Mrs Le Gresley and Mrs Campbell for giving up their time and accompanying us. In English this week we have drafted, edited and published our own Roman play scripts ready to perform next week. In Maths we have been learning all about 2D and 3D Shapes and using Carroll diagrams to sort by characteristics. In History we have been learning all about how the Romans built their distinctive roads and created posters to inform others.</p>
Antarctica (Year 4)	<p>We have worked really hard on writing our non-chronological reports on Henry VIII this week. He was quite a complex character and we tried to capture the essence of his whole life in our writing. In Maths, we were learning how to calculate area and perimeter. In Computing, we analysed data. In R.E, we looked at how Christians prepare for Easter. Our history focus was learning about why Henry VIII broke links with Rome. We looked at the reasons for this and categorised them. We are really looking forward to our trip to Hampton Court Palace next Friday!</p>
North America (Year 5)	<p>Although absent from the class, I have received fantastic feedback about the work North America have done over the course of the week. In English, the children have worked hard to complete their information pages on the Vikings. In computing, the class produced some incredible Viking longships using their skills of creating vector drawings. Children were given the opportunity to convert between imperial and metric units of measurements for length, mass and capacity as well as measuring and calculating perimeter for rectilinear shapes.</p>
South America (Year 6)	<p>What a great week! We have been learning about percentage of amounts in maths and linking this to ratio and proportion. In English, we have finished reading The Land of Neverbelieve and been creating our own</p>

	areas on the island. The children have been really creative with their ideas and thought carefully about the adaptations their animals and plants have. In science, we have learnt about evolution and how living things change over time and in geography we have continued to learn about biomes by looking at the taiga and temperate deciduous forests. In PE, we had our tennis coach in again and we developed our backhand and learnt how to serve and in art we have all finished our final prints.
