Summary

Sports funding was allocated to schools from April 2013. The grant must be used to enhance the provision of sports and PE in schools with the aim of encouraging participation and promoting healthy lifestyles.

The funding is ring-fenced and can therefore on be spent on PE. All pupils at Rudgwick participate in two hours of PE per week. We have primarily used the funding to employ a specialist sports teacher. This has allowed for the professional development of all teachers in the delivery of PE and increased opportunities in terms of the clubs and opportunities that on offer to all pupils at the school.

Through employing a sports specialist the school has been able to establish links with local a sports clubs such as tennis and cricket. The school continues to have a very strong gymnastics group with over 80 pupils participating on a weekly basis.
