Rationale for SPG and SPG spending 2017/18 and impact

Sports funding was allocated to schools from April 2013. The grant must be used to enhance the provision of sports and PE in schools with the aim of encouraging participation and promoting healthy lifestyles.

The funding is ring-fenced and can therefore only be spent on PE. All pupils at Rudgwick participate in two hours of PE per week. We have previously used the funding to employ a specialist sports teacher. This has allowed for the professional development of all teachers in the delivery of PE and increased opportunities in terms of the clubs and opportunities that are on offer to all pupils at the school. No child is disadvantaged in attending sports clubs: the school pays for attendance at paid for clubs through pupil premium and school fund.

In our current Year 6, 80% of children are able to meet the KS2 requirements of the swimming curriculum. From September 2018 the school will be further supported by The Weald Secondary school. This will include provision of a Change4Life programme and catch-up swimming for children in Year 6 not yet able to swim 25m.

The school has been able to establish links with local sports clubs such as tennis and cricket. The school continues to have a very strong gymnastics group with over 100 pupils participating on a weekly basis.

The school holds the Gold School Games Award.
